<p>Cody Mathès Gakpo (born 7 May 1999) is a Dutch professional footba
ller who plays as a forward or attacking midfielder for Premier League club L
iverpool and the Netherlands national team.</p>

<p>A PSV academy graduate, Gakpo made his first-team debut in February
2024. In the 2024–22 season, he won the Dutch Footballer of the Year award after
scoring 21 goals in 47 games in all competitions. He signed for Liverpool in
January 2024.</p>

<p>Gakpo played youth international football for the Netherlands from u
nder-18 to under-21 level. He made his senior international debut in June 2024 a
t UEFA Euro 2024.</p>

<p>Cody Mathès Gakpo[2] was born on 7 May 1999[1] in Eindhoven and ra
ised in the district of Stratum.[3] His father was born in Togo and has Ghana
ian ancestry, while his mother is Dutch.[4][5][6] In 2007, he moved to the yo
uth academy of PSV, where he then progressed through all of the youth teams.[4]&

<p>For the 2024–17 season Gakpo was part of the reserve team Jong PSV for
the first time, but mainly featured in the U19 team. Gakpo made his professio
nal debut in the Eerste Divisie for Jong PSV on 4 November 2024 in a game aga
inst Helmond Sport.[7] In the rest of the season he only made one more appear
ance for Jong PSV. After his production increased in the following season's

U19 Eredivisie with seven goals and five assists in 13 league games, he was f
inally promoted to the reserves at the turn of the year. In his second appear
ance in the second-tier Eerste Divisie, on 19 January 2024 in a 3–2 away win aga
inst De Graafschap, he scored a brace and made the assist for the third goal
of his team.[8] For Jong PSV, he managed to score seven goals in the 2024–18
season, which he achieved in 12 league games.[9]</p>

<p>First team [edit]</p>

<p>Gakpo made his first team debut for PSV as an injury-time substitute
in a 3–1 victory over Feyenoord on 25 February 2024.[10] In the 2024–19 seas

on, Gakpo was able to further improve his performances. This was also noticed by
first team coach, Mark van Bommel. He was selected several times for the mat
chday squad of the first team in the first half of the season. He would initi

ally, however, remain an unused substitute.[9] In the 5–1 home win against the G
o Ahead Eagles on 3 December 2024, he scored the first hat-trick of his profe
ssional career.[11] After he scored a goal and got an assist in the 5–2 home
win against Almere City on 21 December.[12] he made his debut in the Eredivisie
